

STATEMENT OF POLICY FOR A DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE
NAZARENE BIBLE COLLEGE

EMPLOYEE

It is the policy of Nazarene Bible College to prohibit the possession, use, manufacture or distribution of tobacco, alcohol, cannabis, illegal drugs, or other controlled substances, as defined by federal law, at either NBC location or as part of any college activity. Penalties for violations will be enforced as follows:

1. A violation of the policy, as stated above, may result in suspension from responsibilities without pay for a period commensurate with the seriousness of the violations, and evidence of enrollment in an appropriate counseling or rehabilitation program will be a requirement for reinstatement.

Information on counseling and/or rehabilitation resources will be available from the Human Resources Director.

2. A second offense will result in immediate dismissal.

If local, state, or federal laws have been broken at either NBC location or during college activities, the college will also notify appropriate law enforcement agencies. Illegal possession or use of drugs or alcohol may result in criminal prosecution.

It is required by Federal law that any employee convicted of drug violation on the campus (not otherwise known to the college) must inform the Personnel Office within five working days after such conviction. Any employee violating this is subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

Any employee attempting to sell any form of controlled substances, when properly verified, will be dismissed without further notice.
